

The stories are written in the charming style familiar to me from stories by my great-aunts' youth. The pacing isn't always as fast as we're now used to, but it's fun to read if you're into history.

My one gripe is that the scan clean-up is inconsistent. Most parts are perfect, but there are sections where it's distractingly littered with random consonants, mainly an accented "r", and run-on words.
